

# Continuing Education Requirements for the State of Connecticut by the Chiropractic Licensing Board *beginning with 2013 license renewal*

The CT Chiropractic Board of Examiners as part of [Public Act 11-242](#) made changes to the Continuing Education requirements for chiropractors licensed within the State of Connecticut.

Those changes can be found in Sec. 15. Subsection (b) of section 20-32 of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (Effective October 1, 2011): (b)All licensed chiropractors applying for license renewal shall be required to participate in continuing education programs. The Commissioner of Public Health shall adopt regulations, in accordance with chapter 54, to (1) define basic requirements for continuing education programs, (2) delineate qualifying programs, (3) establish a system of control and reporting, and (4) provide for waiver of the continuing education requirement for good cause.

For registration periods beginning on and after October 1, 2012, the Commissioner of Public Health, in consultation with the Board of Chiropractic Examiners, shall, on or before October 1, 2011, and biennially thereafter, issue a list that includes not more than five mandatory topics for continuing education activities that shall be required for the two subsequent registration periods following the date of issuance of such list.

This bill was signed into effect by the Governor on July 13, 2011. At the October 27, 2011 meeting of the Connecticut Board of Examiners it was determined that the programs that would be required are as follows: (1) Ethics (1CE); (2) Documentation / Coding (1CE); (3) Cultural Competence (1CE); (4) Patient Communication (2CE) to include Informed Consent and Boundary Training.

## Special Requirements for Connecticut Licensees:

Starting with renewals from **Oct 2012 - 2014**

Connecticut licensees must take at least:

- One hour **Ethics**
- One hour **Documentation**
- One hour **Cultural Competence**
- Two hours **Patient Communication** (boundary training and/or informed consent)

**48 CE Credits per 2-year renewal period**
